A Message from the President

Hi All,

There seems to be a lot of activity here at the lake despite the crazy weather. The Lake Host program reports the boat ramp is busy with the inspection of boats being launched, the Weed Watchers are gearing up and will soon be paddling around making their invasive species inspections and you may see folks out and about taking samples of the water and sediment.

There are loons swimming around, hopefully they will be putting their new loon raft to good use! If they are successful you will see the Keep Away, Loon Nesting Area signs go up, let's keep our fingers crossed.

A new initiative will be to educate visitors to Province Lake, who park or launch a boat on the lake side of Rt 153, of the negative impact this has on the lake. Visitors will be encouraged to park on the shoulder of the other side of Rt 153, where the shoulder is wider and to launch a boat at the Towle Farm boat launch. This will prevent the introduction of phosphorus, vehicle fluids and other contaminants into the lake and prevent erosion of the beach.

This newsletter is full of information you will find helpful as the summer begins. Please be sure to take note of the change in location of the Annual Meeting to the Effingham Preservation Society, details are included.

The Province Lake Association continues our mission to maintain and improve the quality of Province Lake and the immediate surroundings. One of our primary efforts is to educate our members, area property owners, friends and visitors in ways they can help protect, preserve and improve the quality of both Province Lake and the wildlife and habitat associated with the lake. Many thanks to the EPS for the generous use of their facility for our PLA Annual Meeting.


The Preservation Society will hold their weekly bake sale on the Saturday of our meeting and you will be able to purchase their delicious wares to enjoy while supporting their efforts.

Boating on Province Lake

Summer is here!

Boating is here!

As we launch our various watercrafts onto the lake, we'd like to remind you of a few things to enhance your boating experience while protecting our lake. All boaters should adhere to State regulations, use the appropriate flotation devices and practice responsible boating behaviors.

We encourage everyone to launch their boats at the Towle Farm Boat launch, where NH Lake Hosts can assist in checking boats and offering boaters a new NH Lakes brochure this year. This brochure highlights the importance of rinsing off boats, trailers, and gear with clean water before launching into the next waterbody to prevent the spread of invasive species. Province Lake is one of the few lakes to remain free of the major invasive species and you can help to keep it so.

Remember that Province Lake is a shallow lake. Excessive boat speed will churn up the sediments and release more nutrients into the water, encouraging growth of algae and cyanobacteria. It also increases turbidity that adversely impacts lake plants and animals.

Give our loons some distance when you encounter them while boating. We are hoping for another successful year of baby loons.

NH's free fishing day (June 2) has passed but don't let that deter you from experiencing great fishing on Province Lake. Please make sure you have your fishing license, do not use lead tackle as it is illegal and poisons our loons and other waterfowl. And if you use earthworms, please do not dispose of them onto soil or into the lake. Cyanobacteria

Province Lake had the misfortune to experience the latest recorded cyanobacteria bloom in NH last year. Cyanobacteria is a bacteria that often produces toxins that adversely affect people and animals. Should you see a bloom, you should avoid going in it and especially keep children, adults and pets out of it.

If you suspect a cyanobacteria bloom is occurring, please call the NHDES CYANO hotline immediately at **(603) 848-8094**, or (603) 271-0698 (Amanda McQuaid), or email **beaches@des.nh.gov**. You can also use the bloomWatch app to send a photo.

Please also call the PLA at 207-200-3243 so a sample can be obtained and advisory signs can be posted.

As we mentioned in our April 2018 newsletter, the PLA with AWWA and DK Water Resource Consulting LLC will be conducting a study to collect and analyze data to better understand the cyanobacteria blooms in our lake and what actions may be taken to mitigate them. We are looking for volunteers to assist in our water sampling and cyanobacteria program this summer. This would involve about a day on the lake, once every two weeks, collecting samples. Septic System Improvement Initiative Cost-Share Program

Do you have a home on Lake Shore Drive, Bailey Road or Remick Road that has an old, outdated septic system? Additional funds have become available for cost-sharing for septic system upgrades on properties whose septic systems may be impacting Province Lake's water quality. Septic system inspections in 2016 indicated that the water table in these neighborhoods is high enough that unraised septic systems are in likely failure.

The lesser of \$4,600 or 60% of the septic system upgrades will be awarded to four homeowners whose septic systems are found to be impacting the lake and who can complete the installation in 2018.

Funding for this project is provided in part by a Watershed Assistance Grant to the Acton Wakefield Watersheds Alliance from the NH Department of Environmental Services with Clean Water Act Section 319 funds from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. This is Phase 2 of the Province Lake Watershed Implementation Project working towards the reduction of the excess phosphorus level in Province Lake that leads to cyanobacteria blooms. Faulty septic systems leach phosphorus, as well as harmful bacteria, into the groundwater and then to the lake.
